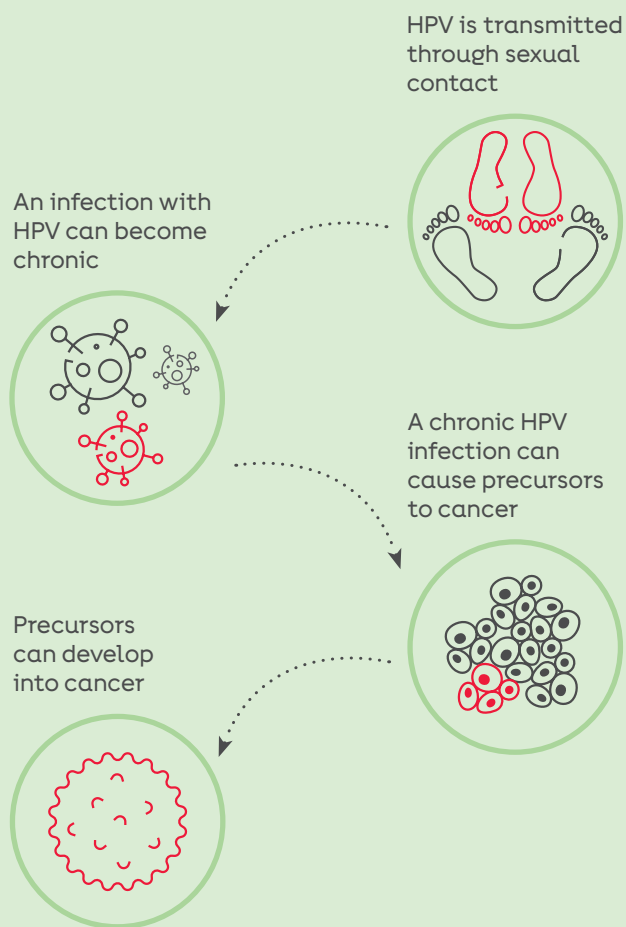

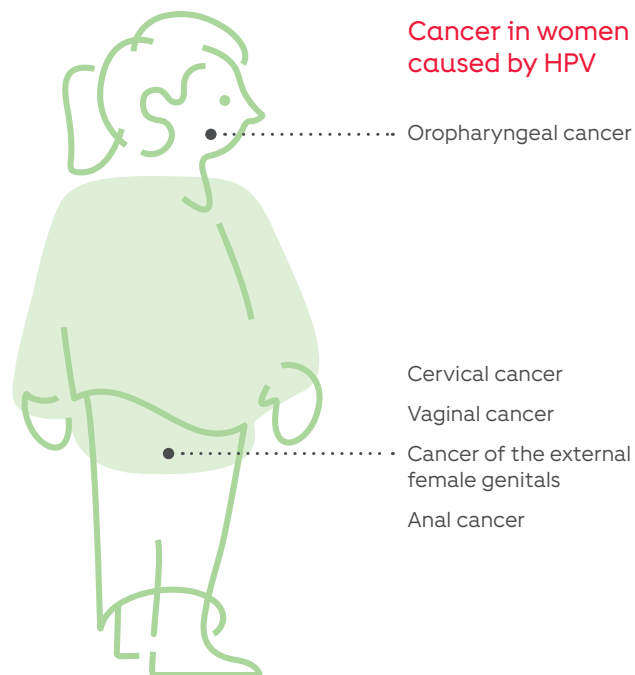
HPV can develop into cancer

HPV (human papillomavirus) is a virus that is transmitted through sexual contact. HPV is highly contagious, but you cannot feel that you have been infected.

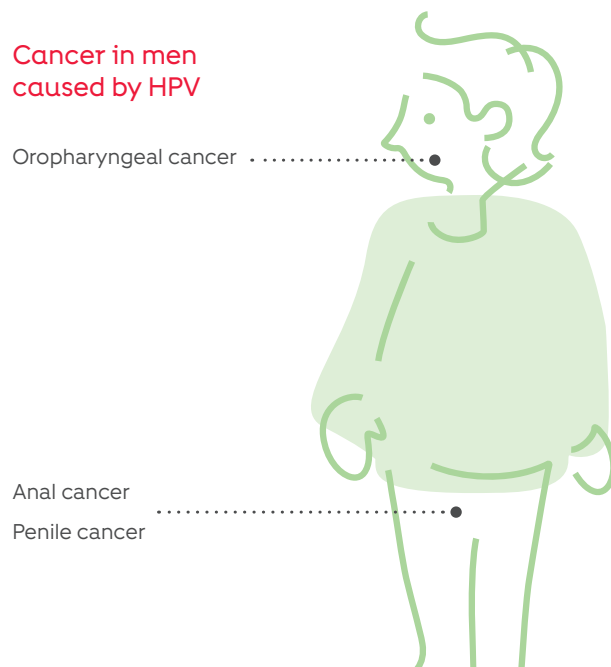
In most cases, the body fights an HPV infection by itself, but HPV infection can also become chronic and develop into cancer.

The HPV vaccine protects against cancer

The HPV vaccine protects against most cases of cervical cancer, anal cancer, vaginal cancer and cancer of the external female genitals (vulvar cancer).

We expect that the HPV vaccine also protects against penile cancer and oropharyngeal cancer.

The vaccine works best if you get it before you become infected with HPV.

The HPV vaccine is therefore part of the Danish childhood vaccination program. The Danish Cancer Society recommends that your child be vaccinated against HPV at age 12.
